

## Anesthesia OOOR Procedure Documentation

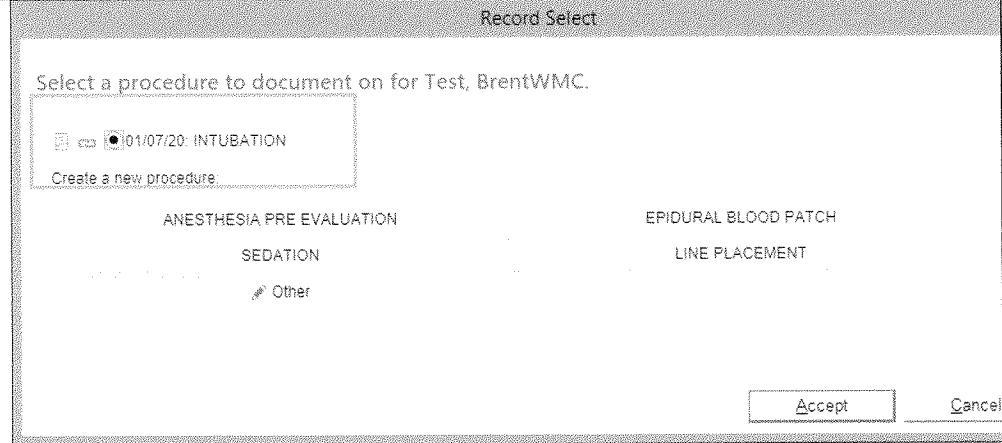
The OOOR Procedure record documentation process is to be followed when an Anesthesia provider is performing a procedure outside of the OR. Examples include: Intubation, PIV placement or Sedation in the ER or Med/Surg Units

Access the OOOR Procedure Navigator from Patient Lists



The user will be prompted to create an Anesthesia record, or open a record that has already been created.

It is important to note that there should only be one record for each procedure performed on a patient. Also important that the actual procedure should not be documented in the Pre Eval record.



The OOOR Procedure Workspace will display a report with patient information such as medications given during the encounter, vital signs, events and notes written on the current encounter.

**Pre:** To be used to jump to the Pre Procedure navigator

**Macro:** To be used to apply the epidural Macro

**Staff:** To assign the appropriate responsible anesthesia provider to the encounter

**Timeout:** To document the timeout items prior to starting the epidural

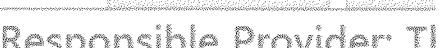
**Blocks:** To document the block note

**Lines:** To document lines inserted

**Airways:** To document airways inserted

**Meds:** To document any meds given during the procedure

**Post:** To be used to jump to the Post Procedure navigator
